#### RULES FOR THE 2 X 4 CHALLENGE

#### ENTRY MATERIALS:

Each entry must be made from one, construction grade, softwood, 2 X 4 X 8 ft.

Any glue or fastening method acceptable

Any wood finishing method acceptable

Other non-wood materials allowed for decorative purposes, or for a usage that cannot be fabricated from wood.

We want to see your 2X4, so please limit the use of opaque finishes.

#### ENTRY NUMBER:

- 1. An Entry Number shall be issued for each entry submitted at the meeting
- 2. Entries will be displayed anonymously, and identified only by Entry Number

#### ENTRY LIMITATIONS:

1. Challenge participation limited to current members An unlimited number of entries shall be accepted from each Entrant All wood components of the entry shall be made from the same 2X4 The majority of the entry must be constructed of the 2X4 material

#### JUDGING OF ENTRIES

Balloting shall be performed by voting of the members present at the meeting
When balloting, each member selects a First, Second, and Third choice from the entries
Members are encouraged to bring unique jigs or tools and discuss any materials, special methods, finishing techniques, etc. used to prepare their entry
Suggested possible entry evaluation criteria:
Craftsmanship
Complexity
Originality
Uniqueness of design
Joinery
Finish
A. Ballots will be counted at the meeting, with the prizes being awarded for the entries receiving

the points.

PRIZE AWARDS (via Woodcraft Gift Cards)

1st Choice Prize = \$35
2nd Choice Prize = \$30
3rd Choice Prize = \$25
Participation Prize Drawing = \$20 (Open only to members submitting entries;
other prize winners ineligible)

Also, even though a member submits one than one entry, he/she is eligible for only one prize.
