#### **April Meeting**

The program for 30 April meeting will feature "Shop Tips". This is your chance to bring-and -brag about your favorite shop tip. This can be on any aspect of woodworking. Bring along the tip, a picture if possible, or just be prepared to describe the idea. Shop tips are frequently published for the craft. What we're looking for is one that is original, never-seen-before. A prize for the most interesting, valuable suggestion will be awarded. Come prepared to join the fun, led by member David Beyl.

SHOP TIPS: To dry-fit a doweled assembly, sand some dowels slightly undersize to allow easy removal. Go back to standard-size dowels for final assembly. Mark and keep the dry-fit dowels for future use.

Stop tightening clamps on a glue-up as soon as the boards come into firm contact with each other. Slight glue squeeze-out is your clue. Too much clamp pressure can result in a glue starved or bowed glue-up.
