### Japanese Festival—2012 Aki Matsuri—in Bellevue



### **Finishing Jig for Table Legs**

I find it easier to apply finish to table legs or spindles before assembling a project. But keeping the workpieces off the bench while they dry is a challenge.

So I built a jig (photo below) that will hold legs or spindles of any length. It's just two, L-shaped brackets with evenly spaced holes for some finish nails. The finish nails are inserted through the brackets and into the ends of the legs.

Now I have a convenient way to apply finish and allow it to dry in the same jig. Arnold Griffee Henderson, Kentucky

















